for New and Early Career Staff



*Are you relatively new to teaching, less than 3 years, and interested in exploring different teaching strategies to enhance your students' learning experience?*

### Who is this programme for?

**MTU and early career staff who have been teaching for 3 years or less (or some equivalent) and are interested in:**

- Developing their competencies in the classroom
- Integrating proven, high quality teaching strategies into their regular teaching practice
- Improving their teaching practice using feedback from students and peers, self-reflection and through engagement with the literature
- Developing a personal understanding of what is meant by “student-centred learning”

### How long will it take?

- EAT-PD runs for 15 weeks over a single semester on Thursdays from 13:00 – 14:00
- Successful applicants will have their **assigned teaching load reduced by 1 hour for 15 weeks** (once approved by Head of Department / Function).

### What is in it for you?

- An opportunity to enhance your teaching and learning practice through structured learning activities and informal discussions with colleagues
- An opportunity to build your professional network by meeting and working with early career staff from across the university
